

About CEI 2007 Conference

The First CEI International Conference in Asia

Caretakers of the Environment International CEI started in 1986. It is an international organization which aims to promote sustainable development education for youth. It features an annual international conference for school age students, usually senior secondary students. It enjoys a history of organizing 20 conferences all over the world.

The 21st Youth Conference of Caretakers of the Environment International (CEI 2007) will be held from 7 July to 14 July 2007 in Hong Kong, China. The QESOSA Secondary School is pleased to host this first CEI conference in Asia. The conference will provide an opportunity for young environment caretakers from different parts of the world to evolve more comprehensive concepts and broader views of sustainable development, as well as acquiring more knowledge and firsthand experience in matters related to sustainable development.



Theme: How to Live in Harmony with the Environment through Active Participation

The eight-day conference comprises plenary and parallel sessions as well as presentations on various topics of sustainable development.

In Chinese, the term "Harmony" is not just a concept but a basic principle and a way of life. Centuries of Oriental philosophy have emphasized the importance of harmony. We seek unity of body and mind, integration of man and nature, assimilation of the new into the old, and co-existence of the natural and the manmade. We discourage opposition, and so for instance, we would prefer to treat sickness by strengthening the body rather than weakening the germs. In Hong Kong, where the East meets the West, the classic meets the novel, and the idealistic meets the pragmatic, we seek harmony in the many facets and levels of human activities.

CEI 2007 encourages our youth to explore how to live in harmony with our natural, social, cultural, and economic environments. "Active participation" is emphasized since we hope that our youth will not just think or talk about harmony and environment issues, but take on active roles from promoting the issue to researching related aspects; from observation to actually serving the environment.

We recommend that you send your project proposal to us before registration, preferably before March 2007. Our advisors and committee members will try to give comments on your project. This would also be a prerequisite for the confirmation of your registration.

Abstract

After we have confirmed your registration, you should send us the abstract (not more than 250 words in Microsoft word format) of your project. It will be included in the conference proceedings. The deadline for the submission of the abstract is 30th May, 2007. Send your abstract by email to project@cei2007.org.
